Registered nurses make up the largest portion of healthcare occupations, and yet, nursing shortages continue to persist. With both an aging workforce and patient population, advances in technology that permit a greater number of health problems to be treated, and an increasing emphasis on preventative care, growth in the nursing field is projected to increase rapidly. Overall, job opportunities for registered nurses are expected to be excellent. In fact, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment of registered nurses is expected to grow 19% through 2022, which is faster than average for all occupations.

However, as is most often the case, candidates with higher levels of education and experience are more desirable to employers and will usually fare better in the job market than those without. Earning a bachelor degree in nursing provides more training in areas such as communication, leadership, and critical thinking-skills that become more important as patient care becomes more complex and as levels of responsibilities within a given job increase. Certain career opportunities in nursing, such as administrative positions, are only achievable with a bachelor degree. Still, other more specialized areas of nursing require even higher levels of education. In many cases, a bachelor degree is required for admission into these graduate-level nursing programs.

While the average starting salary for registered nurses is now over \$44,000, more experienced RN's average over \$65,000, while those in highly specialized positions can earn twice that or more. NURSING ADMINISTRATION CONCENTRATION

Earning an Master of Science in Nursing with a concentration in Nursing Administration allows nurses with experience and an understanding of the field to have an effect on the environment from which they've come. Nursing administrators develop their leadership, management, and communication skills to oversee other nurses with the overall goal of meeting patient needs with the highest quality and standards. While their patient contact may be limited, they are still responsible for the care that patients receive and so must stay current on new and changing laws and regulations for the benefit of that patient care. They may act as liaisons between hospital management and the nursing team of a specific clinical area or they may manage an entire medical practice for a single group of physicians. In either case, their impact on their working environment and patients can be critical.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the job outlook for health service managers, executives, and administrators is expected to grow 23 percent through 2022, which is much faster than the average for all other occupations. As the healthcare industry continues to see increased demand for medical services, other healthcare careers will continue to be in demand. With higher levels of education, experience, larger facility size, and job responsibility come higher levels of pay. As of May of 2012, the median annual salary for medical and health services managers—which includes nurse administrators—was \$88,580. The lowest 10 percent earned less than \$53,940 while the top 10 percent earned more than \$150,560. These are the financial rewards. The personal rewards come when you become the leader of a team of nurses and health service providers that are satisfied in their jobs and providing the best patient care available.

NURSING EDUCATION CONCENTRATION

As the demand for nurses continues to increase at a pace in keeping with an aging baby-boomer population, so does the demand for nursing educators. The Master of Science in Nursing addresses this need with a concentration in Nursing Education that combines two very rewarding fields into one. To ensure quality training and educational experiences for the nursing workforce, there must first be a well trained, educated, and experienced nurse educator.

Nurse educators are responsible for guiding and preparing new generations of nurses in the newest and best practices, professional standards and ethics, culturally focused, and patient-centered approaches to individual, family, and community healthcare.

As a nursing educator, graduates will be able to share their clinical experiences with students as they develop curricula, deliver clinical and classroom coursework, and grade and evaluate class and lab performance, as well as modify those programs in either a clinical or college environment. Operating in the role of a faculty member they can expect to advise students, conduct research, publish papers and books, or write grants. In their position of educators, they realize the value of lifelong learning and professional development.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, as of May 2013, the median salary for nursing educators was \$65,940. The lowest 10 percent earned \$40,950 and the top 10 percent earned \$106,470.
